Day 1: Home—Mittagong, Fitzroy Falls, Kangaroo Valley (LD)

We will make our way to the Southern Highlands with lunch in **Mittagong**, with time to take in some of the crafts that are abundant in the town. After an afternoon stop at **Fitzroy Falls**, we will have some time in historical **Kangaroo Valley** with its array of craft and souvenir and ice cream shops, before checking into our motel in Gerringong.

Day 2: Shoalhaven River Cruise—Berry—Coolangatta Estate (BD)

We will board our morning tea river cruise with **Shoalhaven River Cruises**. Tales of early settlers and captains coming to grief in the treacherous seas will soon see us reboarding the coach at Shoalhaven. We will have free time today for lunch (at own expense) and time to poke around this quaint village which has a great range and diversity of lunch venues available. After lunch we visit the **Berry Treat Factory** for a chocolate making demonstration and most importantly, a sample before a visit to the historic **Coolangatta Estate Winery**.



Day 3: HMAS Albatross & Lady Denman—Huskisson—Botanic Gardens (BLD)

We will stop at the shipbuilding town of **Huskisson**, which dates back to the 1840's, the days of the early shipwrights, including the "**Lady Denman**" an old Sydney ferry. From

here we will head to the **Booderee Botanic Gardens**, which are part of the Booderee National Park, offering a wide variety of plants and animals from all over Australia. This afternoon we will tour **HMAS Albatross**, Australia's premier Naval Aviation Museum.



We will have morning tea in Wollongong at **Janet's Royalty Tea Rooms** with the biggest and best collection of fine wares, before making our way over the new bridge at **Stanwell Pass**.



This is a most spectacular drive replacing the old Seacliff road. Lunch will be at **Loftus Tram Museum** amongst the old trams where we all go for a ride on the restored lines. Departing Sydney we travel over the grand old bridge and make our way back to Maitland.
