Day 1: Blue Mountains, Three Sisters, Echo Point, Katoomba High Tea (H/T,D)

Day 1: Newcastle—Bathurst—Orange (LD)

Day 2: Orange Providores (BLD)

This morning after breakfast we start our day overlooking the town and its many vineyards from the heights of Mount Canobalas. Once we have our bearings, we will visit a local grower for a talk about his industry before a visit to **Hillside Orchard** to learn more about the local fruit tree industry. Max will take us for a walk among the apple, pear, plum, and cherry trees, a very informative morning and the opportunity to buy from their roadside stall. Over lunch at **Mountainside Winery** we will enjoy some more wine tasting and platters of local produce. This afternoon we will visit Borrodell Winery for afternoon tea and wine tasting. This winery also has outstanding views of the valley, our last stop for the day will be a local **Fig and Hazelnut Farm**, with an informative talk from the farmer. On our return to the motel we will enjoy dinner, again with **local wines to sample**.



Day 3: Boree Cabonne Mansion, Manildra Theatre Tour (BLD)

We start our day with some time to enjoy the local Visitor's Centre, art gallery and Shopping centre. An old fashioned country morning tea will be served in the century-old **Boree Cabonne Mansion** and enjoy a guided tour by the great, great granddaughter of John Smith, who took up the lease in 1851. Continuing on from here, we will go to **Manildra**, a very important producer of quality flour. We will have lunch before a tour of the **old silent picture theatre**, with the old reels still very popular when they are occasionally screened. The Director of the Theatre will arouse our nostalgia for the gold old days before talkies!!

Day 4: Orange Produce— Home (BL)

We visit the **Orange Showground** where **Farm produce will be on display**. There is the opportunity to **purchase some of the freshest and tastiest fruits and vegetables, meats and breads**. Remember we are on our way home today so a great opportunity to restock the pantry. Mid morning we reboard the coach for our journey back over the mountains, with lunch on the way arriving back into Sydney mid afternoon and back to Thornton at around 6pm.
